197th year Rochester Genesee Region American Baptist Churches ur mission is to support congregations in developing leaders who transform lives. As we go about our work, we are shaped by the values of respect, Godly justice and reconciliation.

We respect one another as children of God, holding one another in positive esteem, even when we hold different understandings of belief and celebrate with different traditions. Godly justice has to do with loving enemies, refusing to fight back, rejecting the desire to punish and coerce.

The justice of God is revealed in the death and resurrection of Jesus, when love triumphed over power and evil. God's justice has been revealed separate from the legal realm, apart from the law. God keeps working to heal brokenness, as should we. Reconciliation is an element of salvation that refers to the results of atonement.

Reconciliation is the end of estrangement caused by sin between God and humanity and between sister and brother. We believe that we know God better when we are reconciled with all of God's people.

As we join together in God's work, we are directed by the following areas of concentration:

- We embrace diversity as a gift from God.
- We are intentional about building relationships between individuals, congregations, and ecumenical and interfaith communities.
- Through our regional relationships we support one another in faith formation for adults, youth and children; encourage the sharing of spiritual gifts and resources; promote innovative leadership; and encourage practices that lead to the transformation of lives.
- With hopeful spirits, we nurture and celebrate a culture open to new ways of supporting existing congregations and nurture new congregations and ministries.
- We support individuals and churches in intentional acts of mercy and justice in their neighborhoods, communities and the world and by speaking truth to power through witness, education, stewardship and actions.

Statement of Purpose of American Baptist Churches, USA

merican Baptist Churches in the U.S.A., as a manifestation of the church universal, bears witness to God's intention to bring redemption and wholeness to all creation. American Baptists believe that God's intention can be sought and followed in local congregations and other gatherings of Christians and in associational, regional, national and world bodies as they receive from one another mutual counsel and correction. Since Jesus Christ is the head of the church, each body of Christians, seeking to order its life in accordance with the Scriptures under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, has a proper responsibility under God for maintaining its life of worship, witness, and ministry.

In every area of their common life American Baptists, acknowledging the importance of creative diversity, seek such a balance of freedom and order as will keep all parts of American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit and at the same time enable them to work responsibly to carry out the common task of mission and ministry in our time.

American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. acknowledges that it shares a common faith in Christ with churches, which may be quite different from it in history, polity and practice. Consequently, it seeks to share with them a common ministry and to express it faithfully.

American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. acknowledges that God's will is also manifested in movements outside the formal structures of Christ's church, and that, therefore, it must respond faithfully to such disclosures.

American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. further acknowledges and confirms its commitment to the objects stated in its Act of Incorporation as follows: it to give expression to the opinions of its constituency upon moral, religious and denomination matters and to promote denominational unity and efficiency in efforts for the evangelization of the world."

In the light of this affirmation, American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. intends the following statement of purpose to implement and not to alter the objects stated in its Act of Incorporation:

- to bear witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the world and to lead persons to Christ;
- to seek the mind of Christ on moral, spiritual, political, economic, social, denominational and ecumenical matters, and to express to the rest of society on behalf of American Baptists, their convictions as to the mind of Christ in these matters;
- to guide, unify, and assist American Baptist in their witness in the world, in preparing members for the work of ministry, and in serving both those within and outside the fellowship of Christ; and
- to promote closer relations among American Baptist churches and groups, within the whole Body of Christ and to promote understanding with other religious bodies.

Standing Rules 5.1.1. Common Criteria

- 1. Affirm the statement entitled, "We are American Baptists" (revised 6/19/98) as descriptive of American Baptist faith and practice.
- 2. Affirm the mission/purpose of the American Baptist Churches USA and of the Region in which the church is a member.
- 3. Participate in the life and mission of the American Baptist Churches at local, regional, national and international levels.
- 4. Financially support the mission of the American Baptist Churches USA at a responsible level.
- 5. Share with the family the impact of the church's ministries in reaching the community and world for Christ by reporting annually on forms supplied by the region and/or the ABC/USA.

Executive Minister's Report 2023-24 Rev. Dr. Sandra L. DeMott Hasenauer

Reflections on Fiscal Year 2024

To be honest, I have had to consistently remind myself that this year's "annual report" actually begins with the last half of 2023, which feels o-so-long-ago now. Changing our fiscal year to July 1-June 30 means that our annual report, published after the financial review is complete in the fall, means that we're including information from nearly 18 months ago or, in this case, summer and fall of 2023. That's a lot of goings-on to remember!

There has been so much happening that I could never reflect on it here, but as I reviewed all that happened in the 2023-2024 program/fiscal year, I stand in awe and gratitude.

We bid farewell to two churches. The first was First Baptist Church of Keystone at Citrus Park, FL, our furthest south church, as they decided to go back to being the independent Baptist church they were before joining our region a few years back. We also witnessed the closing of the True Faith Christian Fellowship (formerly Historic Parsells, the late Rev. Dr. Carol Garrett, Pastor) which closed in May of 2024. They had a long and storied history and their legacy endures in lives transformed through their mission and ministry. Dr. Garrett's memory continues with many of us who had the privilege of knowing her and serving with her in ministry, and she inspired many people, particularly young women, in ministry.

On the other side of the equation, of course, was welcoming to our regional family the Abundant Life Faith Center, Rev. Arthur Dilbert, Pastor. This vital congregation in the city of Rochester has already blessed our region through its leadership (our region treasurer, Beverly Murrell-Frasier, is a member), involvement, and financial support. We are so glad they are part of our regional family now and look forward to many more years of ministry together.

We received a \$1,000.00 grant from the Minister's Council to use for support in our region clergy and through that grant held some webinars on topics of interest. We also received the Palmer Grant of \$25,000.00, which was disbursed as grants of \$5,000 to five region churches to use in assessment and envisioning. Both of these grants helped us achieve goals we have had for several years, for which we are thankful! Additionally, we did more work on formalizing our management of the Heidi Fuller Fund and the Carol Gomez Fund, both of which you can find on our website at Grants and Scholarships | ABCRGR. These two funds allow us to support education of lay leaders, clergy, and seminarians, another priority of our region.

I have been able to continue in my efforts to create more ties that bind among our region churches by hosting the in-person component of our hybrid Delegates meetings with our churches located outside of Rochester. In September 2023, our three Minnesota churches came together at University

Baptist in Minneapolis for the Delegates meeting, with everyone else attending via Zoom. In February 2024, our two North Carolina churches came together at Watts Street Baptist in Durham for the in-person component; and in May 2024, we had the MissionFest and delegates meeting at First Baptist Church in Rochester, NY. It has given everyone a different perspective on the region, I think, with a greater appreciation for the breadth of our potential impact in God's name.

We established three region priorities in September 2023 based on the Mission Table Priorities from ABCUSA. Our three "takes" on those priorities are "Anti-Racism," "Mental Health," and "Eco-Justice." Unfortunately, setting up the collaboratives for each of those priorities got stuck behind my swiftly-heating-up travel schedule. This is something that we'll be addressing moving forward.

I've said it before and I'll say it again: I love our region. We're not perfect. We don't always agree with one another. But we trust in God and follow Jesus Christ and that brings me great joy.

May God increase our impact for God's purposes in the world.

Eco Justice Collaborative Report

From July 31 to August 4, 2024, the Eco Justice Collaborative hosted a region wide mission trip to do trail work in the Adirondacks. We replaced 80 feet of bog bridging on the Northville-Lake Placid Trail, on a section just east of Long Lake. The four of us were guided by two professional trail crew from the Adirondack Mountain club. We hiked in all of our food, tools, and gear a mile from the parking lot on our backs in one trip. We camped in the wilderness near a stream. The next three days, we hauled in two by fours and base logs from the parking lot, dug up the old, broken bridging, and removed the roots below so we could have space for the new bridging.

We gained a new appreciation for how hard it is to work on the trails. We were glad to hear every passing hiker thank us for our work.
